The Light of Your Life: The Potential Effects of Light On Our Mental and Physical Health

Today, Americans spend 90% or more of their time indoors. But, as little as 100 years ago, the majority of our days were lived outdoors and governed by the rise and setting of the sun. In this presentation, we will explore how this shift from living in a naturally lit environment to one dominated by electric light has potentially effected both our mental and physical well-being. We will discuss how the trend for living in 'cities that never sleep' has only amplified our innate need to be connected with natural light on a daily basis.

But, what if our environment, activities, profession, lifestyle or even physical health preclude us from having access to natural light each day? We will investigate a recent advancement in LED lighting technology that may finally be able to provide the best of both worlds...electric light engineered to provide the potential health benefits characteristic of natural light.

Learning objectives include:

- Be able to discover the meaning of Biophilia as it relates to natural light through the analysis of common case studies.
- Be able to explore why humans have an essential need to connect on a daily level with natural light through the study of its effect on our circadian rhythm.
