ABAA Quality Assurance Program

Presented by John Arcidiacono, Vice President and Senior Building Envelope Specialist/Investigator for TMI Air Barrier Testing, Willow Grove, PA

If you have ever had anything to do with an air barrier system based on MasterSpec, SpecLink, or any number of manufacturers' guide specs in recent years, you are probably aware of the Quality Assurance Program (QAP) of the Air Barrier Association of America (ABAA) and may have wanted to know more. The QAP ties the manufacturer, the contractor and the installer together to ensure that the products are installed properly. It is based on ISO 9000 and ISO 12576-2 standards. This presentation will define exactly what quality assurance is, how it is different from quality control, the impact of poor quality on building systems, and a review of the key components of the quality assurance program for air barriers. Here's your chance to discover more about the QAP, as its application become more critical to the performance of our buildings and Pennsylvania moves into using the 2015 ICC Codes.

Learning objectives include:

- \* Through a review of the air barrier calculator, determine the energy and financial savings obtained by higher level of airtightness and how it impacts the project specifications.
- \* Analyze the results of adhesion testing of various products on various substrates to assist in identifying potential minimum targets in specifications.
- \* Define requirements for quality assurance and control and typical downfalls of specification language.
- \* Determine key field installation issues for various air barrier products and how specifications can provide further clarity.

## **John Arcidiacono**

### **Vice President and Senior Building Envelope Specialist/Investigator**

Mr. Arcidiacono serves as Vice President and Senior Building Envelope Specialist/Investigator for TMI® and is responsible for project quality over-site and field training of all team members.

Mr. Arcidiacono performs air barrier design reviews, multiple fan whole building air leakage tests and diagnostics on large, complex buildings. Mr. Arcidiacono performs field water and air leakage tests on fenestrations, assemblies and mockups. Mr. Arcidiacono is currently beta-testing a new window testing product for The Energy Conservatory (Minneapolis Blower door).

Mr. Arcidiacono is the Lead Professional working with University of California on new technology that has been funded by a grant from Department of Defense (DoD) and Department of Energy (DoE) on air sealing existing buildings using multiple fans. Mr. Arcidiacono will be leading the team testing this technology throughout military installations across the United States and will be zoned air leakage testing, whole building testing, conducting data collection, analysis and recommendations to improve the technology and process, technology transition plans, reporting and publications of research in academic journals.

Mr. Arcidiacono has been involved in multiple federal projects in providing recommendations to bring construction drawings into compliance with the United States Army Corp of Engineers (USACE) Air Leakage Test Protocol and Executive Construction Bulletins (ECB) pertaining to air barrier continuity. Mr. Arcidiacono provides guidance to the Designer of Record on projects in determining proper air barrier test boundary locations and provides guidance on air/water penetration testing of curtain walls and fenestration assemblies.

Mr. Arcidiacono regularly inspects federal, commercial, institutional and military air barrier and spray polyurethane foam installations and writes detailed reports that Air Barrier Association of America, (ABAA) distributes to the designer of record, general contractor and air barrier installer.

Mr. Arcidiacono has been published in the International Energy Agency on Deep Energy Retrofit to achieve significant energy use reduction with major renovation projects working with the USACE, Engineer Research and Development Center on Thermal Bridging.

Mr. Arcidiacono has presented at the ABAA National Conference on “Disconnects in Air Barrier Systems from Design Through Construction” and will be presenting “Site quality assurance and how this has improved air barrier installations” at the Residential Building Design & Construction Conference.

Mr. Arcidiacono was the team leader conducting whole building United States Army Corp of Engineers “USACE” air leakage tests for 6 (six) new construction projects at Camp Lemonnier Forward Operation Site - Djibouti, Africa. He is currently the lead consultant on the Missile Defense Project - Poland, Material Property Lab - Maryland, Cyber Facility - Maryland, University of Maryland, Science Building - Maryland, Thomas Edison University College of Nursing - New Jersey, Swarthmore College Residence Hall - Pennsylvania, Baltimore Ravens Under Armour Performance Facility - Maryland, Asymmetric Warfare Group - Ft. Meade, MD, Shield 5 Program, Site 2, 3, 5 and 7 - State of Qatar, among others for the Department of the Navy and United States Army Corp of Engineers.

Mr. Arcidiacono is a committee member of Air Barrier Association of America (ABAA) Quality Assurance Program, which develops the Daily QC Report forms used by all ABAA Accredited Contractors, and the Field Audit Reports that are distributed to owners, GC's and Architects on all ABAA required jobs. Mr. Arcidiacono is also a member of the ABAA Whole Building Air Tightness Committee responsible for the USACE Building Air Leakage Protocol in conjunction with USACE and currently writing the new ASTM test standard for Building Enclosure Airtightness

Mr. Arcidiacono was an early adaptor in building envelope & air barrier systems prior to joining TMI®. Since early 1990s constructed numerous dwellings under PECO Smart Home program, applied exterior air/moisture barriers to minimize convective loss. Sealed drywall at attic return bays, dammed off floor bays over unconditioned garages, air damn fireplace stacks, attic bays over garages, encapsulated batt insulation at unfinished attic knee wall areas, etc. Tested leakage rate for maximum allowable air changes via blower door units. Guaranteed maximum energy consumption.

Since early 2000's incorporated multiple layer secondary water barrier drainage systems behind primary water barrier system on new and retrofitted exterior masonry/stucco/cement board clad wall envelopes. Systems included water-resistant sheathings, water resistant barriers of 60 Minute D rated asphalt impregnated building paper layers or Carlisle CCW-705 self-adhesive membrane (to facilitate gasketing of fasteners applied from exterior), window/wall interfaces including Carlisle CCW -705 or Grace perma barrier (jamb flashings) over pre-molded lower window corners, back-dammed sloping window/fenestration pans draining outside of the WRB, monolithic woven nylon strand drainage mat stamped in 1/4" corrugated pattern, drains through insect resistant termination barrier onto flashings sealed to foundation at wall/foundation interface.

Designed continuous air barrier system on 2 story office building utilizing 2.5 inch foam insulation applied to underside of roof sheathing from taped & spackled drywall perimeter walls.
